Our Story

17 years ago we started out with one event in Dubbo.

15 boarding schools from Sydney and regional NSW put their faith in this 'new' model and turned up.

So did 60 rural and remote families. Some driving up to 400 km to meet with and discuss their child's education opportunities.

From there, Boarding Schools Expo Australia (BSEA) has grown. We've welcomed over 11,000 children and their families to 56 face-to-face events over the past 18 years.

We've had gaps in proceedings due to crippling drought and, of course, the pandemic.

Time stands still for no one and this is particularly true of the digital mediums we now use. Back in 2005 social media didn't exist, people still faxed each other funny memes, communication was dial up...internet available broadly but certainly not throughout many areas of rural and remote Australia.

The opportunities were just being explored.

Here at BSEA we've grown alongside digital mediums of marketing and we've embraced new technologies.

With that in mind, in 2022 we have proudly launched our virtual platform, 'Boarding Expo 365'. It's been a very busy start up, we've had 28 schools from Victoria, NSW, ACT, Queensland and NT show their faith in our dream and subscribe.

We know that the virtual medium will grow, and it is with this absolute commitment to reaching families across Australia wherever they live, that we will continue to encourage boarding schools to list with 'Boarding Expo 365'.

We want to represent every boarding school in Australia and we want to bring families to the table at the earliest stage.

WITH 480 FAMILIES VISITED OUR EXPO EVENTS TO MEET THEIR FUTURE BOARDING SCHOOL

In 2022 across our face to face events in Dubbo, Wagga Wagga, Tamworth and our pop-up afternoon in Moree, we welcomed 480 families (and almost 1,200 children) keen to start or continue conversations with schools about their boarding options.

Of these, 79% were first-time visitors to one of our events.

Our exit surveys continually demonstrate how important the Boarding Schools Expos are for rural and regional families. The stats continue to show that after attending an Expo, around 80% of families are considering schools they hadn't previously thought of or even short-listed.

These numbers show beyond doubt that schools attendance and responsiveness to the needs of families plays a major role.

We've had around 150 registrations for our virtual Expo (at the time of printing) and those numbers continue to grow. The virtual ensures that families are comfortable to explore their options at the earliest possible stage and keep returning as often as they like.

It's a vital platform for those that live too far away from a face to face event, or are not ready to have that conversation just yet.

These numbers really do speak for themselves – it's just so important to be there face to face, and 2023 will see the team at Boarding Schools Expo Australia provide even more opportunities for you to meet families from right across Australia.

What are your goals by being involved with BSEA?

Being involved with BSEA will enable parents and families to assess the strengths and niche advantages of BTC while they are looking at all the boarding schools available to them and their specific needs.

Dedicated Queensland expo events are a new concept for BSEA, what's the main advantage as you see it to being involved?

Dedicated Queensland expo events provide an ideal forum for Blackheath & Thornburgh College to meet new families and prospective students.

With our home in Charters Towers in north Queensland the majority of our boarders are from around Oueensland.

Do you have any advice for other boarding schools wondering if these events are for them?

As Blackheath & Thornburgh College is new to Boarding Expo events we are looking forward to the connections we will be able to make with other boarding schools and lessons learned from others in the same industry.

We are also enthusiastic about being involved in events with a specific dedicated audience looking for what we have to offer.

Why did you participate in BSEA events this year, and particularly the new online format?

The Boarding Schools Expo provides a fabulous opportunity for us to meet and talk with prospective Boarding families face-to-face. In this relaxed environment we can help families discover the benefits of boarding at Loreto Normanhurst for their daughters.

It is great for prospective parents to be able to meet our staff and have them answer any questions they may have in a personalised way. We also love it when our current boarding families pop in to catch up and say hello.

We understand that it is not always practical for families to attend the Boarding Expos with time and proximity being a barrier for many. We were keen to participate in the Virtual Boarding Expo to bring the Boarding Expo experience to life for those who could not otherwise attend.

What is the current boarding situation at Loreto - challenges?

Loreto Normanhurst is the biggest all girls boarding school in NSW. Over 80% of our boarding students are from rural and regional NSW, with others from the Sydney basin, interstate and overseas. As we anticipate the construction of our new boarding school, which will open in 2025, we will be growing the number of boarders from 180 to over 200

We are excited to welcome 19 new Year 7 boarders for 2023- and these girls are all currently participating in our 2023 Orientation Program.

We pride ourselves on our pastoral and academic care programs, our flexible boarding model and our weekend recreation program, which allows us to support and grow a thriving community of boarders at Loreto Normanhurst.

What are your goals by being involved with BSEA?

Our goal is to drive awareness of the benefits of boarding at Loreto Normanhurst with families around Australia who are looking at a boarding school for their daughters. Through our involvement at expo, we want to support families by providing them the input and information they need as they make this important decision.


What was your highlight from this years' events?

Why did you participate in BSEA events this year, and particularly the new format Boarding Expo 365?

The expos and Boarding 365 ensure we are responding to a targeted market. Boarding Expo 365 enables us to put IGGs and IJGS Boarding in front of families that cannot attend an expo or are not aware of the option of "Country Boarding in the City" – people can literally log on at any time and explore our School.

Ipswich is a special town in that we are so close to the advantages of many big cities, including Brisbane, The Gold Coast, Sunshine Coast and Toowoomba. Our boarders can easily access cultural activities like taking in a live show or musical performance in Brisbane, and are equally well placed to spend a day at the beach or mountains. In our own backyard we have much to explore with walking trails, shopping centres and so much more on our doorstep. Ipswich itself is quiet and away from the hustle and bustle of big city life. It truly gives the feel of a small country town and the advantages of big city life.

What is the current boarding situation at IGGS - challenges?

The boarding family at IGGS is a lovely mix of students from rural areas, those who live close by but choose to board to make accessing sport, performing arts or academic opportunities easier, and international students.

The diverse nature of our community means our boarders are exposed to many different world views and opinions, helping to make them informed global citizens. For the past three years boarding enrolments have dropped.

Restrictions around Covid and the closure of state and international borders did make it challenging in the boarding space. IGGS has an exceptional student well-being program, led by our Dean of Students Rebecca Sullivan. In cooperation with Rebecca, our School psychologist and boarding staff we were able to support our students through the challenges of Covid lockdowns, and extended periods of time away from their families.

With relaxation of restrictions, 2023 is seeing an increase in our boarding numbers. During 2022, our boarding facility, Cribb House, has undergone major refurbishment. Rooms and common spaces have all been upgraded, and a fantastic outdoor area has been added with a barbecue and views overlooking the Scenic Rim.

What are your goals by being involved with BSEA?

We want to build brand awareness – we found have found that many people, including those who have lived in Ipswich all of their lives did not know that IGGS offered boardina!

We have a proud history of boarding, dating back to the School's opening in 1892. We are also looking to increase enrolments from rural students that are not too far away from us geographically.

We're a family of 5 with chidren aged 11, 8 and 7. We are located 40km west of Dubbo and run a mixed cropping/livestock farm and a pharmacy. All of which keep us on our toes!

Can you share with us why you're considering boarding school as an option for your children?

For us it's about the opportunities that boarding school presents. There is the option of an hour long bus trip to Dubbo for high school however, we would prefer for this time to be spent on extra curricular activities, leisure or homework. In addition, with the ages and stages of our children it then becomes a logistical nightmare to get some children to the bus early whilst the others are in town too early for their school drop off.

From your visit to the Boarding Schools Expo, what were the highlights for you?

Our highlight was speaking to the directors of boarding in person. These interactions and building of relationships enabled a connection and a feel for what sort of people were leadersin these houses that our children would come to call 'home'.

Why did you participate in BSEA events this year?

BSEA provides a wonderful opportunity to connect with regional families in a welcoming and comfortable environment. It's also very helpful for us, as a school, to plar our community events around the Boarding Expos, so we can reconnect with our families and alumni in those areas.

What's it like being under one roof with dozens of other boarding schools?

Having many boarding schools presenting in one place is great for families, because there are so many incredible schools that all have their unique points of difference that parents are looking for. Choosing a boarding school for their children is a significant emotional and financial decision, so providing an occasion where they can connect with the schools they are considering is really important. Families start to get a 'feel' for the people who are going to care for their children.

Is there value for you, as a member of the boarding schools profession, to be able to network with people from the same 'industry'?

I've found that all the school representatives are very warm and welcoming. The expos create opportunities – in between parent conversations – for boarding leaders to discuss the current climate of boarding and what we are all doing to engage our students and families. It is a tight network of people who are passionate and understand the lifestyle that is boarding.

How do you share the story of Riverview at an event like ours?

Our school has over 140 years of tradition, with its humble beginnings starting as a boarding school with just 12 students. Today we have almost 300 boarding students cared for by key staff members, a number of whom attend the expos so parents can meet and chat with the people who will be caring for their children and ask questions directly to them. We have also had Riverview parents and students from the area attend our boarding expos to share their first-hand experience to perspective families.

What would you say to schools who feel it may be a risk to be 'in the room' with their competition?

The expos are not about competing with other schools but rather offering families a welcoming space to find out what is 'real' about your school. Each school has its strengths and being present at the expos provides an opportunity for families to investigate further if there is an alignment of values. The key is understanding your school's identity and having an intimate understanding of your culture, so you can share these with families who attend the expos.

I have the enviable role of inviting prospective families to join our special CGGS community, walking them through their child's enrolment journey, and building relationships with our families along the way.

I work with a small, dedicated team, and we love nothing more than seeing our new students walk through the doors on that first day, full of anticipation about the opportunities that lie ahead for them. If or when our families have to leave our school for any length of time, it is also my goal that they feel as welcome to return as they did to begin.

Why did you participate in BSEA events this year, and particularly the new format Boarding Expo 365?

CGGS has attended the BSEA for a number of years now, and we have found it to be a fabulous way for rural families to investigate the first-class offerings of Australian Boarding Schools, right in their home towns

The fact that families can engage with multiple school representatives, and ask questions in a relaxed and welcoming setting, is key to finding the right fit for them.

And Boarding 365 is such a great initiative! We all want to be everywhere at once, but interstate and international travel is not always feasible – this platform allows us to be visible and available to prospective families literally every day of the year!

What is the current boarding situation at CGGS - challenges?

Our heritage-listed Boarding House has capacity for up to 80 full-time boarders, and we are excited to be slowly rebuilding our numbers to prepandemic levels.

We have full-time and shortterm boarders from Years 7 to 12 from all over Australia, and are very fortunate to be welcoming new international students next year. COVID created many challenges for us and all schools – but, like everyone, we are hoping that the worst is behind us.

What are your goals by being involved with BSEA?

By representing at BSEA, CGGS aims to meet as many families as possible who mightn't otherwise have heard of us, or considered us as an option. By giving families the chance to meet our team, they get a glimpse into the culture and values of CGGS.

We also want everyone we meet to feel very welcome to visit us for a personal tour and see for themselves why we speak so highly of it.

What was your highlight from this years' events?

So many highlights!

First and foremost, it was consider to definitely meeting new families potential. and talking to them about what they want in a school. The BSEA

It was also really lovely to have past students call by, introduce their families, and tell us about their positive experiences at our school. But equally as rewarding was

catching up with the staff from all the other schools; meeting at regular intervals on the BSEA 'roadshow' is a fantastic way to build a network of support. I love that there is no sense of competition between the schools, just the sense that we are all there for the same reason – to allow families to find the best boarding school to suit their child.

Being from the Riverina myself, I really loved seeing some familiar faces from my home region, and afternoon tea with our current and future families in the Wagga region after the Expo was the very best way to end the weekend.

Do you have any advice for other boarding schools wondering if these events are for them?

Just get on board!

As the College Registrar and Leader of Community Connections Bev aims to inform, connect and engage with staff, students, parents and community members.
